

- Provide a forum for the community to come together to celebrate the sport of baseball and preserve the Vancouver Asahi Legacy






— FOUNDING MEMBERS (01)

John Wong, President

He has coached baseball for over 20 years and coached his three sons and daughter during that time, and as such, he has created a deep family passion for the game of baseball. Despite their Japanese Canadian heritage, his sons and daughter were not familiar with Japanese culture and history until the Asahi Baseball Association. In 2015, his youngest son was named the Japan Tour Team, and John was the head coach.

Through the ABA and the tours to Japan, John's family has learned more about their cultural mosaic and feels that they have grown closer to their Japanese roots. John believes the original Vancouver Asahi Baseball Team is a significant legacy in Japanese Canadian history, and he is passionate about keeping its legacy alive. All of this, combined with his passion for baseball, was the impetus for creating the Association.

Emiko Ando, Past President

In 2014, Emiko was a crucial figure in assembling a youth baseball team to participate in the first Asahi Legacy Game. She was one of the organizers of the inaugural Japan Tour in 2015 and was the president of the club for three years. She is currently the past president of the Association, and she continues to help guide the Association.

As the president of the club, Emiko helped locate and present 20 unclaimed BC Sports Hall of Fame medals to families of the original Vancouver Asahi team. Emiko's younger son, Alec, played on the 2015 Japan Travel Team. After playing for the North Shore Twins for four years, Alec then went on to play with the UBC varsity baseball team. Emiko works as Senior Counsel for HSBC Bank Canada.

Tomio Fukumura, Vice President

Born in Tokyo raised in Vancouver. Tomio's passion for coaching extends beyond baseball. As a National Team Ski Coach and a Kendo sensei for over 35 years, he understands that fundamentals, discipline, respect and perseverance are essential in every sport and life. He has coached his older son, Hilo, from Little League to Bantam AAA and the 2015 and 2017 Japan Travel teams for the past seven years. Hilo now plays with the University of BC, and his younger son Koa is pursuing baseball in Japan.

Through the Asahi Baseball Association, Tomio has had the opportunity to learn more about the history of the Japanese Canadians and has grown closer to the Japanese Canadian Community. He sees how the Asahi has brought many generations and families together, and he is incredibly proud of how far the Association has come. The positive stories he hears from the Asahi parents, the compliments from opposition coaches, and the players' success continue to inspire and motivate him every day.

— FOUNDING MEMBERS (02)

Russ Hiroshi Kada, Head of Baseball Operations

Russ has always been actively involved in sports his entire life. In the 1970s, Russell was a student at the Vancouver Japanese Language School, where he served on the Board of Directors for eight years. Russ has also been a coach and manager for teams at Hastings Little League, District 6 Saints, Burnaby Baseball Association, North Fraser Nationals, and Asahi Baseball Association.

Russ describes Asahi as the epitome of baseball; it celebrates history, respect, and unity. In 1914 Asahi brought people together. We continue to maintain the pride, joy, and love associated with the game and pass on the traditions of the original Asahi players.

Sammy Takahashi, International Liaison

Born in Tokyo, Japan, Sammy has lived in Vancouver since 1991. He currently manages several language schools in Vancouver. He served as Vice President of the Japan-Canada Chamber of Commerce from 2013 to 2015 and Director from 2013 to 2017. Cody, his younger son, was a travelling team member for 2015.

He played an integral role in organizing the Japan trip as the liaison between Yokohama, Obu High School in Aichi, Tenri High school, university baseball teams, and the Tenrikyo Church in Nara. In 2014, a Vancouver Asahi film prompted his involvement with the club during the Vancouver International Film Festival. He wanted to be a part of the effort to revitalize the spirit of the Vancouver Asahi by creating a new Asahi team.

Manabu Ogawa, Medical Conditioning Trainer & Shiatsupractor

Originally from Japan, Manabu now lives in North Vancouver. Before immigrating to Canada, he served as a firefighter and Japan Police and Fire Federation member. Presently, he is a Medical and Conditioning Trainer and Shiatsupractor. In addition to his regular patients, Manabu has worked with Japanese and Canadian National Team Athletes for over ten years. His connection to athletes and sports, particularly baseball, goes back more than 30 years. He played high school baseball in Japan, coached in Japan and Canada, and organized several local tournaments.

The significance of Asahi for Manabu reaches back to pre and post World War II, when life in Canada was challenging for Japanese immigrants. In a world of confusion and discrimination, the Asahi baseball players were heroes who united the hearts and minds of the Nikkei community and the Anglo communities. He pays tribute to those players who persevered and overcame social obstacles. Manabu believes that the Shin Asahi symbolizes peace and brings together new players while honouring the Japanese Canadian heritage through the Asahi Baseball Association.




Demographic Reach within ASAHI Membership

— OUR PHILOSOPHY

The actions of players are a reflection of themselves, their team, the Asahi Baseball Association and their community, and the game of baseball. A player's involvement in baseball provides opportunities and experiences that are important to the development of a well- rounded individual; however, players must remember that their participation in baseball and functions as a member of the Asahi Baseball Association is a privilege, not a right.

The Asahi Baseball Association (ABA), we focus on spreading the Japanese way of baseball. We value the concept of team, discipline, and respect. Though it is important to improve as a player, without the other members of your team, you cannot play the game. It is important to think about how you can become better to raise the level of the whole team. The type of training that we do is to help raise the level of the players, to make the team stronger as a whole.

We do want each player to find and play their own individual style of baseball and bring that style and skill to contribute to the team.

"Always start with respect and end with respect"

This is an important part of Japanese culture. Culturally, there is a belief that there is a soul in everything, from the mountains and sun, to your simple objects and possessions. Japanese have always treated inanimate objects and living creatures with deep respect as to not disrespect the spirit dwelling within. This belief transcends to baseball as well. The equipment, the ball park, and even your cleats all contain a soul. This is why we will not tolerate actions such as kicking the ball, throwing your equipment, spitting on the field, eating during games and practice.

The respect shown to inanimate objects is also given to the people that have helped you reach where you are. We must always show respect, gratitude, will and spirit in whatever we do. In action, we show these feelings by bowing. Bowing is not only something that you have to do because you have to. It's an important ritual that you do to communicate these feelings to others. This is the reason we bow to the opponents, umpires, coaches, and spectators, to thank them and to promise that you will give everything you have till the very end. Though it may be difficult at first, this is something that we hope the players will come to understand.

Respect also goes for your coaches and teammates. It is expected for the players to give coaches their full attention when they speak, respect their fellow players, to help with prepping and tearing down the field and dugout, and lining up at the beginning and end of every game and practice.
