

OBJECTIVES

- Operate a supervised program of baseball spreading the Japanese way of baseball and the Asahi spirit.
- Form and develop youth and adult teams to play in leagues, tournaments and exhibition games, locally or internationally.
- Instill in players the ideals of respect, good sportsmanship and best effort, with a goal to becoming well adjusted, stronger and happier

- players and grow to be productive citizens with integrity.
- Give Japanese Canadians families opportunities to connect with each other and be involved in the Japanese Canadian community.
- Provide a forum for the community to come together to celebrate the sport of baseball and preserve the Vancouver Asahi Legacy.

PROJECTS & PROGRAMS

A. Annual Asahi Legacy Games

Each year we honour the Vancouver Asahi by hosting the Asahi Legacy Games. In 2015, we had five Asahi teams from ages 8 up to adult. Four different games were played including the Championship Game between the Midget Shin Asahi team (ages 14-16) and the Men's Asahi team. Fundraising budget: \$3,000 to cover event related expenses.

B. Training Sessions and Tournaments

Since October 2014, our volunteer coaches have provided baseball training to our youth members.

We teach the Japanese way of baseball and instill in players the Asahi spirit. Instruction is in both English and Japanese and is open to all youth, regardless of gender, ethnic origin or residency. A small fee is charged to help cover some costs.

After intense training, two Shin Asahi youth teams travelled to Kamloops to play tournaments. Kaye Kaminishi, the last surviving original Asahi player, encourage the teams from the dug. The teams placed first and second in their division.

Fundraising budget: \$4,000 for equipment costs, tournament fees, facility rentals and insurance.

C. Bi-Annual Japan Tour

Every two years, the Club plans to take a team of players aged 14 to 16 to Japan. They will travel to Yokohama (Vancouver's sister city), Obu and Tenri. The Shin Asahi players will practice alongside Japanese players to experience Japanese practice style as well as play games. Players will interact with their Japanese counterparts, share stories and experiences. The tour will deepen the relations between Japan and Canada.

Bi-Annual Fundraising budget: \$27,000 to help defer costs of sending the team overseas.
